Accomplishments July 2019 - June 2020 13th Year

> Land Conservation and Stewardship:

- Conducted monitoring walks for Hartland Land Trust's Bassett-Kell Preserve as well as for the Charles and Lois Beach Nature Preserve
- Awarded an ILF Grant from Audubon CT for the purchase of 65 acres on Route 20 in West Hartland
- Closed on the 65 acre Route 20 parcel in West Hartland and established the "Mill District Nature Preserve"
- Awarded an ILF Grant from Audubon CT for the purchase of 45 acres on Route 20 in West Hartland to be added to the "Mill District Nature Preserve"
- Received a grant from the FRCC for land protection
- Commissioned and obtained a baseline ecological report and management plan for the Hartland Land Trust (HLT) "Mill District Nature Preserve" in West Hartland, written by forest ecologist Harry White
- With the help of local volunteers and HLT board members, designed and built trails for the Charles and Lois Beach Nature Preserve
- . Built a Kiosk with a trail map and trail use guidelines posted for the Charles and Lois Beach Nature Preserve
- Hank Prussing made and installed a "Leopold Bench" for Beach Preserve rest area and one for the Edith Leopold Sanctuary at kiosk

- Presented Forum "Mostly Owls" by Eileen Fielding, Director of Audubon Sharon, June 2019 and also Speaker Series on Ticks- Dr. Kirby Stafford of CAES, September 2019
- The Hartland School Pollinator Garden, sponsored by HLT, was visited by New England Buck Moth, a sighting farthest west in CT
- 2019 CT Trails Day Guided Hike MDC water level- had over 50 participants
- Hosted table at the 2019 Fire Dept Carnival all 4 nights and for the first time marched in the parade
- Collaborated with Hartland School for the 8th year in the Salmon-in-Schools project
- Published the 13th edition of Newsletter, "The Preservationist"
- Local arborist/volunteer Heike Krauland created tree identification signs and posted them on the Beach Preserve Trail
